## Hey guys! We've come up with some interesting challenges for you!

Writing challenge 1: Click on this website to take you to a spinning wheel. Randomly select 4 different items to write into your story. Your story could be a finding tale, portal story, rags to riches tale - whatever you decide! Writing challenge 2: Draw the main character of your story (It can be from the previous challenge or a brand new one!) and label him/her/it with as much detail as you can. Think about what they look like, where they live, what their interests are, what their personality is like. You can use the character description sheets to help guide you (there are two different options you can use to help you).

Writing challenge 3: You are a mad scientist and have invented a new vegetable. Draw it! What is it called? What does it look like? What does it taste like? Most importantly: Is it safe to eat? There is a planning sheet to help you with this too!


Writing challenge 4: Do you have a favorite song? Write about the type of music you like to listen to. You may like to google the lyrics (check with your adults first!) and write them down in your book - a chance to practise your handwriting!

It is so important to keep up practise with your spellings! In your books, we have provided you with the words from the Year 3 and 4 spellings list (some of you have the Year 2 list). We would like you to do 5 new spellings each day from the list . We would like you to write down the word in your home learning books, then do LOOK: Look at the word, try to memorise it. COVER: Cover the word so you can't see it.
WRITE: Write down the word you've covered.
CHECK: Oncover the word. Did you spell it correctly? If so, move onto the next word. If you didn't, try again.

When you have done your five words for the day, use the word in a new sentence of your own. You may have to look up some words online if you are not sure what they mean.
