How Can I Help My Child at Home?

- Play lots of sound and listening games with your child.
- Read as much as possible to and with your child.
- Encourage and praise get them to have a 'good guess'.
- If your child is struggling to decode a word, help them by encouraging them to say each sound in the word from left to right.
- Blend the sounds by pointing to each one, e.g. /c/ in cat, /p/ in pat, /ng/ in sing, /ee/ in been.
- Discuss the meaning of words if your child does not know what they have read.

Help your child with **literacy** at home

The story that we are learning is called *Mrs Armitage on Wheels* by Quentin Blake. As a school, we learn stories and other texts using the Talk for Writing technique. With your child, learn the story by putting actions to it and see if they can practise it until they can remember it off by heart.
